<u>December 11-15th</u>: So many wonderful **Winter**<u>Celebrations</u> to enjoy together! We'll learn about the customs of Christmas, Hanukkah, Kwanzaa, and New Year's. From hand-made gifts to menorahs, and yummy cookies to Kinara candles, there is so much to learn about the traditions of our friends and neighbors. Our letter will be Cc for celebrations. Our colors will be red/ green, the number is 14, and the shape will be a star!

<u>December 18-22nd</u>: We'll explore our inner scientists as we experiment with our STEAM theme. Steam stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math. School Policy Reminders:

Please wash your child's hands as you enter the classroom. This policy helps us prevent the spread of germs. We also wash hands frequently during the day in order to prevent illness. Hand-washing is the most important way to prevent the spread of germs. Also, please look over our illness policy online (under forms in our parent hand-book) if you have any questions regarding when your child can or cannot attend due to illness. We strive to provide a healthy learning environment, so children with an illness must stay home until they are symptom-free for 24 hours without the aid of medication. If your child requires specific medical care, additional sleep, or would need one on one care they should stay home and recover prior to attending preschool.

Please note that our pick-up at the end of the day is between 12:45-1:00. At 1:00 any remaining children will be brought up to the library to wait for their parents. A late pick-up fee of \$1/ minute will be assessed if a child is consistently picked up later than 1:00pm. To prevent additional fees, please arrive in time to pick-up by 1:00. Thank you.

Monthly Tuition is due on the 1st of the month and must be paid in full by the 5th of the month. Any remaining balance left is subject to a \$25 late payment fee. To avoid this fee, please pay by the 5th. Thank you.





Hide a certain number of candy canes around one room in the house. For younger children a smaller number such as 5 works better, for older children you could do 10-15. This activity allows children to use their senses to find the hidden canes. They can practice counting the canes they found and even rehide them as many times as they are interested. Another great way to extend this activity is to explore prepositional words such as over, under, behind, underneath, inside, and beside to describe the hiding places and identify these words as you show your child what they mean.
